

### A FUTURE FOR THE POCKLINGTON CANAL?

In 1990 British

Waterways prepared a document entitled A FUTURE FOR THE POCKLINGTON CANAL? It was a discussion document and various options for the future of the canal were considered. In it BW stated that their preferred option was "full restoration with limitation of navigation". At the time this was a great step forward because it was probably the first occasion that BW had declared their support for the restoration project. Later their words were followed up by actions that gave us further reason to believe that BW had a commitment to the project. It was in this climate that the restoration of Walbut Lock was undertaken.

WHY THE CHANGE OF ATTITUDE? More recently we have noticed that British Waterways have been more cool in their support and I have challenged the Regional Manager to declare exactly where BW stand on the matter. The responses have been either non-committal or evasive, thus re-inforcing our doubts about their commitment to the project. We will, of course, continue to press BW for a firm statement of support for the restoration project.

**PCAS DETERMINED TO PRESS ON!** None of this will have any effect on the Society's objectives or determination. Our work will go on whether or not it has the support of BW, and I am sure that we will succeed in the end. History does have a habit of repeating itself and various canals have been restored in the past without the benefit of whole-hearted support from the owners. The British Transport Commission and its successor, British Waterways Board, put all sorts of obstacles in the way of the restoration of the Peak Forest Canal but the project went ahead. Now it is classified as a *Cruising Waterway*. Will it be the same story on the Pocklington?

### \* \* DESPITE ALL OUR TRIBULATIONS THE NEWS IS GOOD!

**WALBUT LOCK** Firstly the work at Walbut Lock is now virtually complete. Some adjustments are required to the gates, and the temporary bywash trench needs filling in. The project, although it took slightly longer than we hoped, has cost a little less than we anticipated. The Society can be justly proud of itself here.

NO 8 SWINGBRIDGE Following their closure and subsequent removal of the unsafe wooden deck of this farm accommodation bridge in November 1992, British Waterways had declared their intention to rebuild it with a new fixed span. (They have little option over this as the Pocklington Canal is a *Remainder Waterway* and not a *Cruiseway*, so that their spending is strictly limited). When it became clear that we had at least *some* money available, we decided to go ahead with full restoration. This was a collaborative effort between British Waterways and ourselves. It has also benefitted from a grant of £5,000 from Humberside County Council who have now designated a public footpath to connect the towpath with the village of Bielby at this point.

## CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN continued . . .

As reported in our November issue, PCAS organised and paid for a new steel deck which was completed a year ago, though it cannot be permanently installed until completion of the foundation works. These have been a collaborative effort between British Waterways and ourselves. BW, because of their statutory obligations to continue to provide a farm accommodation bridge, have carried out the underwater foundation works and have contributed the greatest part of the cost, and the Society has paid the balance. The bridge is now in place, although it does not swing at the moment. The Society will shortly be going in to rebuild the retaining walls around the bridge recess and to do other works to complete the job.

**TOP LOCK** In recent months Society working parties have been at Canal Head at Top Lock. One wingwall has largely been rebuilt and the lock is being prepared to receive a pair of top gates. This will allow the dam in the top pound to be removed, which will greatly improve the appearance of the canal by the Picnic Site which is, after all, our 'shop window'.

**GARDHAM LOCK** We have, at last, received notice that East Yorkshire Borough Council will fund the cost of replacing the rotten gates at Gardham, up to a maximum £15,000, to be paid on receipt of the appropriate invoices. This is something we have been hoping for for a long time (it is 18 months since the Society first approached the Council) and it is indeed good news. The works are planned for October so as to allow time for construction of the gates and to avoid the main part of the cruising season.

**THE FUTURE** There is plenty of work scheduled for 1994 --- Top Lock, No 8 Swingbridge and Gardham Lock --- but we are already planning future projects. Consent is being sought for dredging upstream of Melbourne, with a view to working on one section next winter. Beyond that, our next big project will probably be Coates Lock. With the experience gained at Walbut I would anticipate that rebuilding this lock should take less time than Walbut. However, the start date will depend on funding and we do not have any funds in place for Coates as yet.

Ken Goodwin died at the end of January. He was on IWA Council from 1973, first as National Treasurer, then as Chairman. In 1989 he stepped down due to ill-health. But restoration was dear to his heart and he still maintained a punishing schedule supporting schemes around the country. Over many years he did much to encourage PCAS and to promote our cause at national level. The last time I saw him he was far from well, but warm-hearted, entertaining, and enthusiastic as ever. We had just unloaded his car, which he regularly filled --- and it was filled! --- with cans and foil collected up for Pocklington, and which he used to deliver to Westminster Road, en route from Macclesfield, and earlier from Wales, to various far more important people and places. Ken was a great personality and he had a great talent for getting people on his side--to the great benefit of our waterways. He did a great job.

WALBUT As some of you will have seen at Canal Head, the Thermometer Board has gone! The £50,000 target for the Walbut Appeal was reached this winter! Our warmest thanks to all our many supporters! Names of recent donors will appear next time. (Sorry, but at the moment the Auditor has the list!) NO LET-UP THOUGH! As Paul has made clear, the Society has plenty more jobs to be tackled. And whilst we press on with restoration, the already restored parts need to be kept that way. There are also items like more public information boards, maps etc. We have more machinery to maintain and insure (We have just bought a useful second-hand crane). It all costs money! So the fund-raising must go on!

**NESTLE UK VOLUNTEER AWARD** In February PCAS received a cheque for £200 from NESTLE UK in York. Thanks to new member, Paul Graham, who works for Nestle and who who is also a regular PCAS volunteer, and who applied their VOLUNTEER AWARD FUND on our behalf. THANK YOU ALSO TO NESTLE.
